

Executive Session

Council agreed to meet Friday at 10:30 a.m. in executive session to review applications for the Groundskeeper position. Flea Market proposal from SVCV

Council unanimously voted to approve the SVCV's proposal to run the Flea Markets.

Council Input

Clarke stated he would like to start a street maintenance fund for buying gravel, grading roads, plowing snow and the like. Woolf said she and Bookkeeper Kathi Vinson have been discussing using part of the 3% cannabis tax to go into the street fund. She stated after do-

ing some figuring, they are proposing in the 2017/2018 budget \$15,000 from this source for the street fund and \$15,000 for the general fund. They are hoping revenue sharing through the state will allow them to put in another \$8,000.

Wise asked what will happen if they don't get that much. Jenny Long stated that based on current sales, the City will receive at least that much. McKinney said the City received confirmation that they are good to go with the ordinance passed regarding the cannabis tax. She doesn't know if the City will receive anything this year because there were no cannabis sales in 2016.

Clarke stated the squirrels at the Grounds are out of hand and he'd like to

find someone to take care of the problem. There was much discussion regarding poisoning versus shooting. Karen Peters said she doesn't think shooting them will sufficiently take care of the problem. Others mentioned concerns with poisoning and potential effects on pets and birds. Clarke stated he'd like to see the issue taken care of before the next Flea Market.

Public Input

Myrna Clarke asked about Resolution 2017-4, on prohibiting marijuana growers in Sumpter. McKinney explained there is a public meeting on April 20 at 6 p.m. Woolf clarified that testimony must be in written form and must be at City Hall by 5 p.m. that day.

The bill also requires 25% of money deposited in Housing and Services Department accounts be allocated to provide affordable housing.

Martin discussed with the Board the topic of service animal issues in the Courthouse. She said that certain people had brought animals,

which are not necessarily service animals, into the Courthouse building, and McQuisten said that he had observed two separate incidents, and he has concerns about liability. Harvey asked about signage, and McQuisten said there wasn't any placed on or in the building yet. In discussing what a County employee could legally ask an animal's owner, Martin said that the following two questions could be asked: "Is the animal required because of a disability," or, "What task or service does

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this animal intend to do?"

The Board discussed some general 2017-2018 budget concerns with Cook, PILT (payment in lieu of taxes) and budget carryover issues being two of the top priorities for her, she said.

In discussing these and other concerns, Bennett said that, as it stands now, there would be a 7% decrease in PILT funding from last year's amount.
