"Many times families that are in poverty, that would be really unfair for the child to come and their siblings to not be able to afford to come," said Savage. "So, we make that possible, 75 coupons went out, we usually get a really good participation with kids from Head Start."

Savage explained that last year they had a record of around 150 and this year they had around 154 children who attended the event.

"Our goal in certain projects is to go through all the supplies," explained Savage. "And we only had three tables that might have two left over projects, so that's a real winner for us."

This project was funded

by the DE and Jane Clark Foundation.

"We are always welcome to quality art supplies, craft supplies," stated Savage. "Sometimes we have to say no just because of storage. But we have cubbies where we can put all this stuff in and store it and then you let an artisan look at something and people can donate things and it's always appreciated."
