The couple had long yearned for children and finally came to the decision to adopt an infant boy from among the German "brown babies."

The Hubbards looked for "their" son in several homes for children and on a visit to Munich, 300 miles away, continued their search. There they were urged by the sisters in charge of the kinderheim to at least see Brigitte who was then four years old. One look between would-be parents and Brigitte and they knew they wanted to be together always.

Brigitte is six-years-old now and is delightedly making acquaintance with her grandparents.

The Whitlows invited 35 or 40 friends in to meet their son-in-law and daughter on Saturday evening. Along with cocktails the Hubbards showed motion pictures they filmed while abroad.

When they have any reason to believe they are being discriminated against solely because of race, religion or national origin they should contact the State Bureau of Labor in the State Office Building either in Portland or Salem.
