the Fair Employment Practices Law is the greatest impediment of all. In spite of the success of the law we still hear the chronic grippers. Their complaints run something like this:

"What good does it do to go to college? All that education just to open boxes or sweep floor? That's not for me. Anybody can open a box." "I'd try something different from what I'm doing now but get in one of those jobs and you either have to work yourself to death or take a whole lot of stuff from some guy that doesn't know beans from a bowl of chili."

"I am tired of being told we don't hire colored people here and it's not much use of filing a complain that FEPC won't do anything about it."

Prejudice Still Here

In spite of the great deal of prejudice still with us, barring your own shortcomings, you have an equal chance in the state of Oregon with all other persons to a job. As long as there are biased employers, employment agencies and labor unions you may run into discrimination.

The knowledge of this may make you uncomfortable. There should be comfort in the knowledge that it is better to face up to it and to do something about it in the hope of stopping it.

If you possess the necessary qualifications for any one of the many new available job opportunities and apply for it and it is denied to you if you have reason to believe that you have been denied an equal chance to qualify for the job because of your race, color, religion or nationality you have a right to refer your complaint to the State Bureau of Labor in the State Office Building in Portland or Salem. They will not fail to help you with your problem.

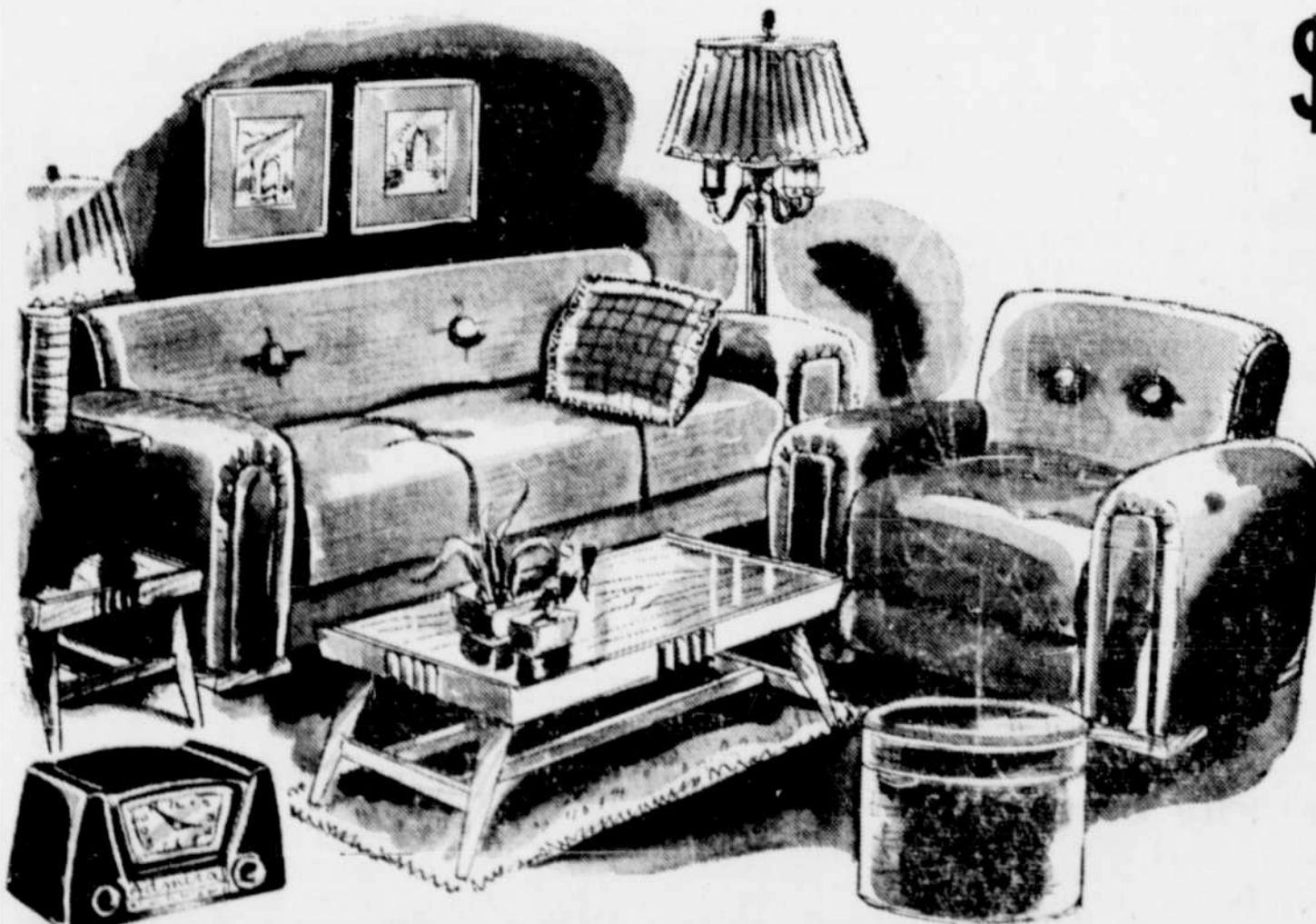
