A Step Foward

The recent action taken by the board of trustees of Lewis and Clark college in regards to national fraternities on the school's campus is certainly a step in the right direction.

The board gave it's sanction to national fraternal organizations on the campus providing they "admit for membership persons of all races, creeds and color."

Recently an optometric honorary at Pacific university in Forest Grove dropped its affiliation with its parent organization because of the "Caucasians only" requirement.

Other schools have had to follow a similar course in order to stay in line with the tenets of American democracy.

Fraternities can be of great service to society. They can be builders of good citizenship or simply cliquish organizations that adhere to a childish philosophy of pseudo-superiority because of close and "privileged" associations.

State educational institutions can take note of Lewis and Clark's advancement in human relations. Oregon and Oregon State permit fraternities on their respective campuses that prohibit membership to certain racial, creed and religious groups.

By the same token Negro Greek organizations can perk up and follow the Lewis and Clark pattern of "Greek equality." Too many groups—although many have deleted the "Negro only qualification"—exist because of racial segregation and base their programs accordingly.

They still think in terms of "Miss Bronze Somewhat or Other" or in terms of most "exclusive dance or party" ever given by "the city's most popular fraternal organization."

There are no two ways about this business of integration and the long-sought, elusive equality of peoples is too evident to risk a "dilly dally around" with a social whirlwind based on a closed society of people.

There is much work to be done in civic activities and the like and fraternities, especially graduate chapters, can take the lead in building a much better society and awakening the people to the civic obligations so necessary on their part if the equality they so fervently seek becomes a reality.

Yes, fraternal organizations can most certainly be good. And it is to the good of them all that they think in terms of good government. Social outlets are good, but it is for the good of a decent society that they take a lesser part in the curriculum of Greek organizations. Moral courage and backbone should be the guide in good fraternal leadership. America needs such leadership.
