Open Air Opera Slated for Bowl

Another production of Portland's nationally famous open-air operas "free to the public, will be staged in Washington Park Bowl, August 8, 9 and 15, when the Portland Civic Opera association will present Verdi's great "Il Trovatore" under the musical direction of Ariel Rubstein.
