### Scholarships

One teacher and two water safety instructors have been awarded scholarships by the Portland Association for Retarded Children, a U.G.N. Agency. The association's scholarship program is now in its sixth year with a record of eighteen scholarships for teachers and two scholarships for water safety instructors for a total of \$1660 being awarded. Contributions for this program come largely from individuals and groups recognizing the need for trained personnel.

The scholarship recipients this year are Mrs. Ona A. Brown, 8140 S.E. Duke Street, teacher, and Mrs. Howard J. Bouchor, 8519 N. Buchanan Avenue and Miss Monttie Marie Wallis, 424 N.E. 53rd Avenue are Red Cross Water Safety Instructors.

Mrs. Brown will take course work leading to certification as a teacher of the mentally retarded at the Portland Center Summer Session. The coming school year she will be a substitute for the Portland Public Schools and next year plans to be a full time teacher of the retarded.

Mrs. Bouchor and Miss Wallis will be taking instruction this summer in California at the American Red Cross Aquatic School on Instruction of the Handicapped. Both are instructors in the association's swimming program for the mentally retarded.


