## W.L. Bond Drive Goes Over Mark

Stirred by a Thursday assembly speech by Chief Boatswain's Mate Howard C. Rice, U.S.C.G., that if by Friday night W. L. H. S. would raise enough war bond money to pay for the building of a jeep, he would see that the jeep would be named in accordance with their desires, students of the high school staged a hectic one-hour war bond sell-off and raised \$2,168.50.

The amount added to \$726 contributed earlier in the week brought West Linn high school's total for the first week of the second war loan drive to \$2,894.50, a sum large enough to pay for the building of three jeeps.

The students plan to nickname the three jeeps "Chet," in honor of Chester Tunnell; "Suzy," in honor of Suzanne Zimmerman; and the third one "The Roaring Lions," in honor of the accepted symbol of all West Linn school activities. "West Linn High School" will also be painted on each jeep.

One of the jeeps was brought to West Linn on Friday and christened by Queen Suzanne in a short assembly.
