LIONS BOW 31-6 TO SPARTAN TEAM

The Hillsboro Spartans, last year's TYV league champions, defeated the West Linn Lions by a score of 31 to 6 on the Hillsboro gridiron September 30.

Jim McIntosh cut loose with a total of 18 passes, of which nine were completed, six of them to Alden Rondeau and three to Don Atchison.

In the second quarter Atchison snagged a long one and sprinted ten yards for West Linn's lone touchdown.

The score then stood at 13 to 6 with the Spartans out in front.

In the third quarter Hillsboro drove to the Lions ten-yard line, advanced to the five on a penalty, and scored on a pass, Connie Sproul to Jerry LeBlanc.

The Spartans recovered a West Linn fumble on the kickoff and again smashed their way up to the Lions' ten-yard line.

Again it was a five-yard penalty against West Linn and another touchdown pass, this time Sproul to Bob Jones.

In the fourth period West Linn's doom was sealed when the Spartans scored from the 35-yard line with a long pass from Sproul to Marty Hamkinson, who carried the ball over for the final touchdown.

LIONS TIE TIGERS IN LEAGUE OPENER

Coach Burnett's fighting Lions battled to a six-all tie with the Tigard Tigers in their TYV League opener in the Tigard gridiron Friday night, September 23.

Early in the first quarter West Linn took the ball on Tigard's 38-yard line, and with Larry Lee making some nice runs on double reverses, advanced to the six-yard line.

Jim McIntosh then smashed his way through the Tigard defense for West Linn's lone touchdown.

In the second quarter fullback Jim Smith sped around his own right end for a twelve-yard run which tied up the score for the Tigers.

From then on the game was fought out in mid-field with neither team scoring nor gaining much yardage.

Tigard suffered a great loss in the third quarter when their speedy right half Doug Akers received a broken leg.

Papermakers Make Pulp of W. L. Lions
