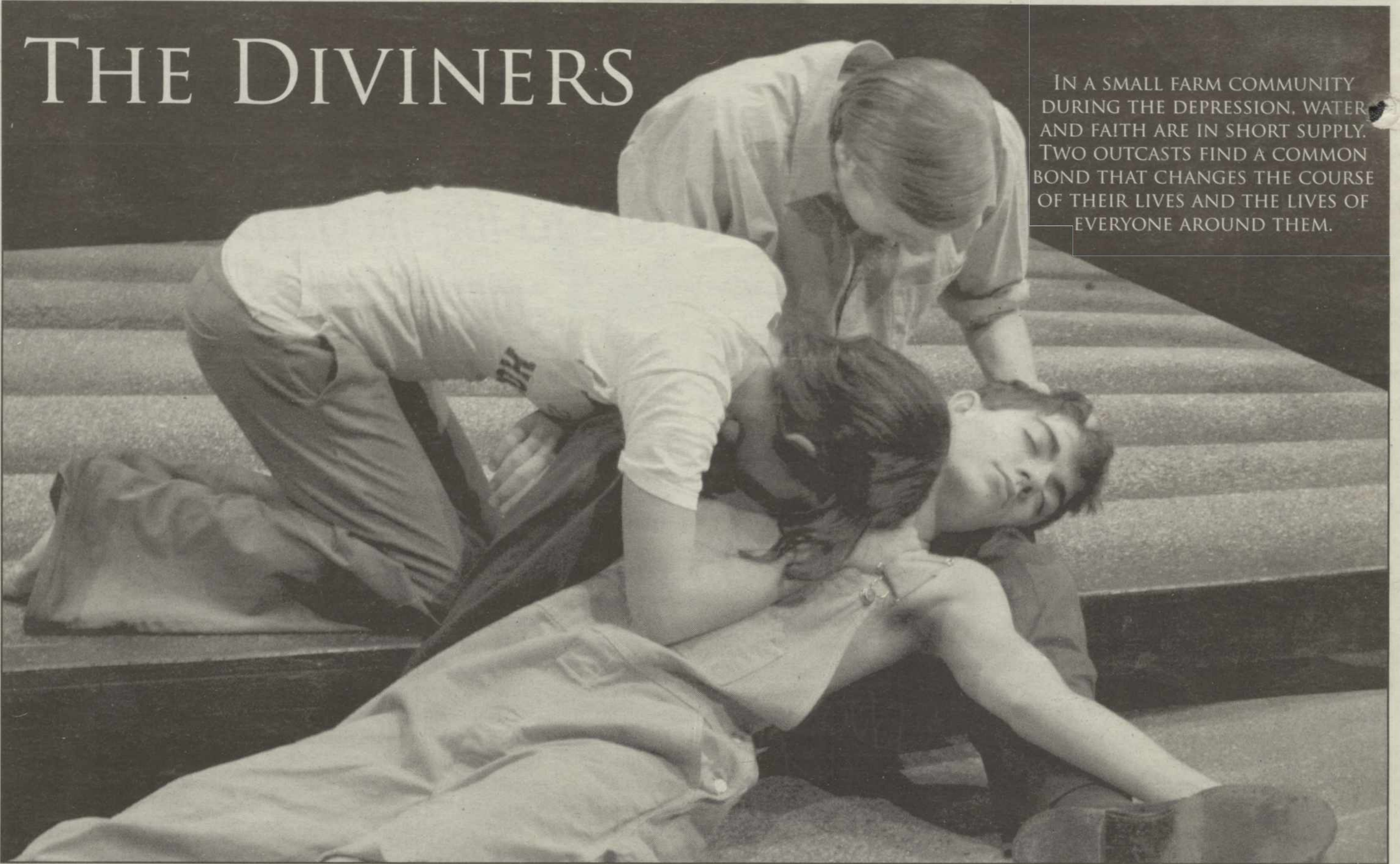


THE DIVINERS

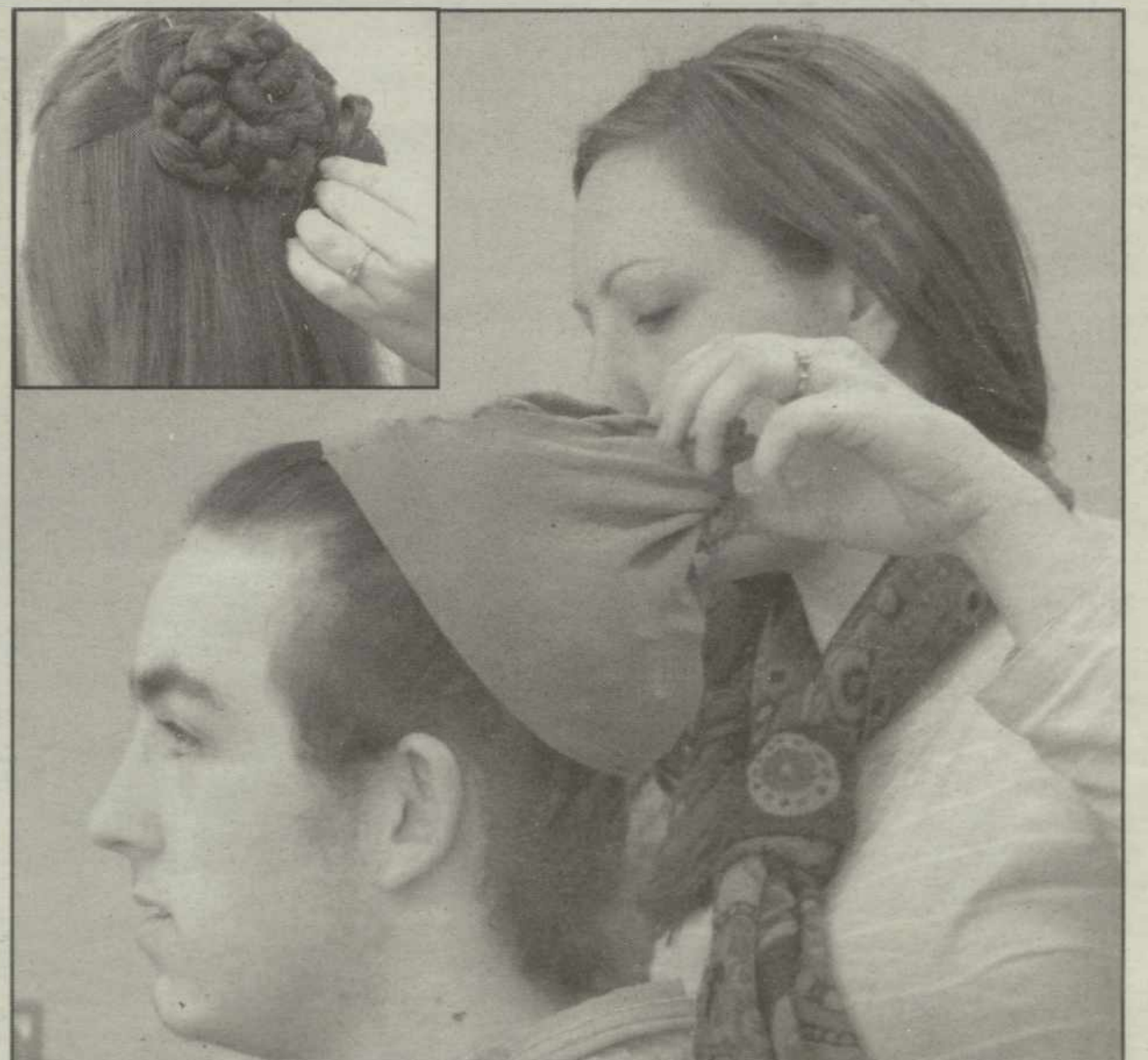
