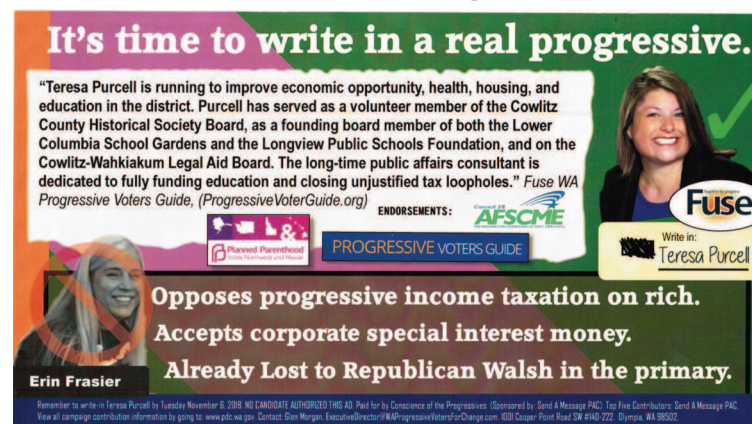

Republican operative sends counterfeit union mailings to mislead Washington voters

Republicans in several closely-fought Washington electoral races stooped to a new low this year: sending out mailings with labor organization logos to trick voters into writing in the names of candidates who aren't running ... in order to drain support from union-backed candidates who are running.

Since mid-October, the mailers have gone out to as many as 100,000 voters in Thurston County and at least four state legislative districts, including Southwest Washington's District 19, which stretches from Longview to the coast.

The deceptive mailings come with the label "Progressive Voters Guide" — alongside the lo-



gos of groups including Washington State Labor Council (AFL-CIO), AFSCME Council 28, American Federation of Teachers (AFT), United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 21, and the non-

profit advocacy group Fuse Washington, which has put out its own Progressive Voters Guide since 2008. The "Progressive Voters Guide" label in

Trump White House deletes rule that would have required union-busters to file disclosures

No presidential tweet announced it, but the Trump Administration this July quietly repealed a rule that would have brought sunlight to the murky world of professional union-busters. For five decades, a regulatory loophole has kept workers and the public largely in the dark about union-busting activity — despite a federal law mandating public disclosure when employers hire the so-called "union avoidance" consultants. The Obama Administration's "persuader rule" would

have closed that loophole.

The saga stretches back to 1958, when Congress was investigating corrupt and undemocratic practices in unions. The following year, Congress passed the Labor Management Reporting and Disclosure Act (LMRDA), also known as the Landrum-Griffin Act.

Thanks to the LMRDA, the U.S. Department of Labor has some oversight of union officer elections, and private sector unions must file annual disclosures known as LM-2 or LM-3

forms which detail staff salaries and other financial information almost down to the penny. Since 2001, those reports have been viewable online.

The LMRDA wasn't aimed just at union abuses, however. Congress had also heard testimony about union-busting consultants, and the LMRDA imposed disclosure requirements on them, and the employers who use them. But in 1962, the teeth came out of that part of the law.
