## BULL Session gives lots of moola to 6 children's charities

BULL Session Charity Events donated more than \$300,000 to six Oregon children's charities that provide life-changing treatment and accommodations. The checks were distributed Nov. 14 during a ceremony at the offices of the Portland offices of the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA).

The BULL Session is a coalition of business, union and labor leaders who come together to help provide support services for children. The money was raised at the 28th annual BULL Session golf tournament and auction, held Sept. 10-11 at the Oregon Convention Center and The Reserve Vineyards and Golf Club, respectively. More

than 400 golfers took part in the golf tournament this year.

Since its inception in 1991, the BULL Session has raised \$6,523,500 for the charities, making it one of Oregon's largest charity events.

This year's recipients were Albertina Kerr Children's Crisis Psychiatric Care Unit, Gales Creek Camp Foundation, March of Dimes, Shriners Hospital for Children-Portland, Swindells Resource Center of Providence Child Center, and Wheel to Walk Foundation.
