Chuck Moffit, 1952-2019

Longtime Oregon AFSCME officer Chuck Moffit died in his sleep of natural causes Feb. 4 at the age of 66. He and his wife Robin Mariani-Moffit were vacationing near Cancun, Mexico, celebrating their wedding anniversary.

After retiring in 2008 following 22 years as an accountant for the City of Portland, Moffit became active in the Oregon AFSCME retirees organization, serving as president of the Portland chapter and vice president of the state chapter.

While at the City, Moffit served as steward, executive board officer, and vice president of AFSCME Local 189, the city government's largest union. He also served as treasurer of Oregon AFSCME, the public sector union's state-level council.

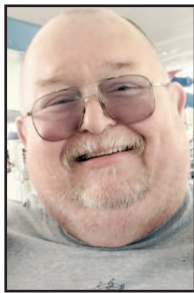
Union friends remember him as a skilled parliamentarian who kept meetings on track. Moffit stood up for what he believed, fought for the underdog, and didn't like management bullies.

Moffit was active in the American Legion and the Elks Club, and was president of the Portland Bowling Association.

CHARLES EMERY MOFFIT III was born in Portland, Oct. 5, 1952, Moffit graduated from Beaverton High School and enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served from 1971 to 1984, spending the last five years as an chemical weapons instructor at Fort Lewis, Washington. While in the Army, he attended college, and earned a bachelor's degree in accounting at St. Martin's University.

He is survived by his wife Robin Mariani-Moffit, a retired City of Portland 911 dispatcher and fellow Local 189 officer; and three daughters from a previous marriage.
