Stamp Out Hunger food drive postponed

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the 28th annual Letter Carriers' "Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive" originally scheduled for May 9 was postponed. A new date has not yet been scheduled. The annual food drive is sponsored by the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC), and is the largest one-day food drive in America.

"We look forward to holding the largest one-day food drive in America when it is safe to do so," the Letter Carriers posted on their web site.

Washington CLUB golf tournament canceled

This year's event was to be a major celebration as it looked to celebrate its 20th anniversary.

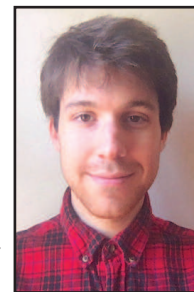
