Outstanding communications support during a multi-agency response to a knife fight at a bar, a K9 track resulting in a suspect taken into custody, a residential structure fire in which all residents and the family dog were safely rescued and relocated to shelter provided by the Red Cross, a multi-agency response to a shooting, and a successful multi-agency search and rescue of two children garnered 2006-7 Critical Incident Awards for Communications Specialists Trish Hilsinger, Deb Franklin, Nathan McCallum and Supervisors Terri Levie and Tracy Edinger. Two incidents in which the 9-1-1 call taker provided CPR instruction to revive a baby who had ceased to breathe due to an obstructed airway earned two Lifesaver Awards for Communications Specialist Trish Hilsinger.

Public Safety Partner awards were given in appreciation for assistance provided in the selection of a new community outcall notification system to Mike Cave from Dyno-Nobel in Columbia City, Diane Dillard from Boise in St. Helens, Vernonia Police Chief Matt Workman, and Columbia River Fire and Rescue Chief Jay Tappan. Special recognition was given to Alicia Little of Dyno-Nobel who also maintains the contract for the system in partnership with Columbia 9-1-1 and the Columbia Emergency Planning Association.

Herb Schroeder and Scott Miller, service technicians with Qwest, were presented Public Safety Partner awards in appreciation for their expertise and good humor under pressure during technical conversions, upgrades and repairs to the emergency call reporting system.

Columbia County Sheriff Deputy Scotty Davidson earned the Public Safety Partner award in appreciation for his supportive good nature and professional approach in spite of extreme pressure of many calls and callouts from home.

Employees of the Year, selected by Columbia 9-1-1 staff and presented as a surprise at the end of the ceremony, were Communications Specialist Trish Hilsinger, Operations Manager Lee Knowlton and Administrator Sally Jones. Hilsinger was recognized for her ability as a new employee trainer; she is quick to help others, is highly competent, shows a great deal of compassion with callers, and makes a complex job look much easier than it is. Knowlton was recognized for setting a standard of integrity for all employees and for his sound advice, patient coaching, meticulous record keeping, and fairness.

The event was followed by a chicken, ribs and salmon barbecue prepared by Board Members Henry Heimuller, Dee Wooley and Wes McMahan.
