When the congregation outgrew its small country church many years ago, donations were collected to purchase the current property on Missouri Avenue in Vernonia. A parishioner, Louise Smekjal, began gathering scraps of material and enlisted the help of fellow quilters to make quilts that could be sold to raise funds. Over time, enough money was collected to start construction, and parishioners pitched in and literally "built" the church that is used today. At a later stage, a hall was added that now houses the quilt fair.
