## Building the Vernonia School Keeping it Local: KLS Surveying

### What they do:

Land Surveying (staking building, water, sewer lines)

### What's the history?

Current owner and Vernonia resident, Don Wallace, bought the business from long-time resident Jerry Keenan in 2004. Keenan, a former Crown Zellerbach employee, started his business by providing surveying for local timber projects. Today, the business has diversified into construction and works in over seven counties, including two in Washington state.

### How's business?

Work is down, like everyone else. Their current staff of six is half of what they were a few years ago. The work is "week to week" rather than being booked months in advance.

### What this project means for business?

KLS has been working on the project for a year to prepare the site. It represents about 20% of their workload and has "probably saved laying off someone". As an added benefit, the fact that it is a local business helps cut down on transportation costs for the District.

### What this project means for the community?

"We got hit hard by the 1996 flood and didn't have flood insurance. The next day I was working on the house; we had a one-year-old and two-year-old daughter at the time. A high school boy stopped and asked if I needed help. He stayed until 10 PM, hauling out wet carpet. This is one of the few places where you have a community. Building a new school keeps it a community."
