Columbia County has a new jewel in its crown.

The Crown Zellerbach Trail, spanning the twenty miles from Scappoose to Vernonia is open and ready for use this summer. Although Columbia County has not held an of-

Stretching from Chapman's Landing on the Columbia River to the outskirts of Vernonia, the CZ Trail, as it is known, is open for use by all non-motorized traffic, including bikes, horses and hikers.

The trail gives local users and visitors a new opportunity to experience the beauty and history of Columbia County and could become an outdoor recreation draw and economic stimulus for the region.

"This is very exciting," says Columbia County Commissioner Tony Hyde, who has been a proponent and champion of the
