#### Cletus Richard "Dick" May



Cletus Richard "Dick" May, died at home on March 22, 2014 in Salem, OR, losing a two and a half year battle with acute myeloid leukemia. He was born in Yakima, WA on Sept. 23, 1930 to Willis Richard May Jr. and Dessie Frances Vinson. He was the middle child of seven and always claimed that middle children were the best adjusted.
