tests for kids and grown-ups. We are also starting discussions to include the annual Bear Creek Run as part of Jamboree weekend and may be adding a half marathon as well.

The Jamboree Committee has worked very hard to raise money this year so we can have as many activities as possible. 
With all the hard work that the
