Robert T. "Bob" Brady, Jr., a former resident of the Vernonia community, late of Portland, died Saturday morning, August 30, 2013 at the Legacy Meridian Park Medical Center in Tualatin.

Things to Ponder: What Kind of Righteousness?

What is your source of righteousness? Is it something external based upon a set of standards established by you or someone else? Are you concerned about what other people think or are you willing to stand upon the demands of our Holy God established in the Bible?

Paul in his letter to the church in Colossae wrote in chapter 2:16-17, "So do not let anyone make rules for you about eating and drinking or about a religious feast, a New Moon Festival, or a Sabbath day. In the past, these things were shadows of what was to come. But the new things that were coming are found in Christ." Many people love to make rules and force them on everyone else, but there is a good reason God established a new kind of righteousness, found only in Christ!

Our righteousness is not found in keeping rules but in a relationship with the living Lord Jesus. In Colossians 3:1-3 Paul continues, "You were raised from death with Christ. So aim at what is in heaven, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God. Think only about the things in heaven, not the things on earth. Your old sinful self has died, and your new life is kept with Christ in God. Christ is your life. When He comes again, you will share in His glory."

When considering what standard you should live by and who

you should emulate you need look no further than your Savior. His life is the perfect pattern to copy. Anything Christ did you can do because He was found without sin. Remember Jesus' promise in John 14:12? He said, "I tell you the truth. He who believes in me will do the same things that I do. He will do even greater things than these because I am going to the Father."

It is a scary endeavor to step out in faith and obey God, but it is worth living for Him and not those who wish to impose their standards on others. Once again in Colossians 3:12-14 Paul reminds us of who we are in Christ, "God has chosen you and made you His holy people. He loves you. So always do these things: Show mercy to others; be kind, humble, gentle, and patient. Do not get angry with each other, but forgive each other. If someone does wrong to you, then forgive him. Forgive each other because the Lord forgave you. Do all these things; but most important, love each other. Love is what holds you all together in perfect unity." It is always a good thing to remember that judgment day is coming when everyone will stand before God. On that great day we will be rewarded or punished based upon God's standards not men's.
