




## Where Do You Read the Voice?

## VOICE FIRST in Oregon.

It is important to know that in Oregon, you cannot yet reach 9-1-1 by sending a text message from your wireless phone.

- Should you attempt to send a text to 9-1-1, you will receive an immediate 'bounce-back' message that text to 9-1-1 is not available and that you should contact emergency services by calling 9-1-1.
- Oregon is working towards upgrading its infrastructure to allow text to 9-1-1 messages, but it may be years before it is available. The 75 cent emergency tax consumers pay every month on their cell phone bills will help to fund the new infrastructure.
- Even when text to 9-1-1 becomes available, you should **always** make a voice call to 9-1-1 if you are able and it is safe to do so.
