In the last 4 years we've all had the opportunity to learn how to be a friend, a student, and a teammate. Our coaches and teammates helped us learn how to win together

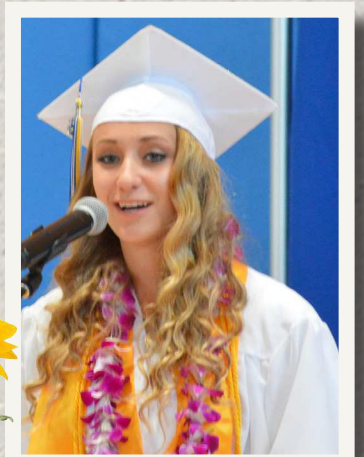
but more importantly how to lose together because you can't always win.
