Edward "Archie" Dass



Edward "Archie" Dass, 80, a lifelong resident of the Vernonia community, died Sunday morning, March 4, 2018 at his home.

Graveside Services were held on Saturday, March 10, 2018 at 1:00 pm at the Ver-

nonia Memorial Cemetery with Pastor John Cahill officiating. A Celebration of Life Service followed at the Natal Grange Hall.

Edward "Archie" Dass was born November 20, 1937 on the family homestead farm in Vernonia, the son of the late Ike John Dass and Mary (Cook) Dass. He was raised and received his education in the Vernonia community. He started school in the one room Natal Grade School. He then attended Mist Grade School and then graduated from Vernonia High School in 1955.

He was united in marriage to Margaret "Jeanette" Olson on February 10, 1968 in Vernonia. Following their marriage they made their home in

the Vernonia community, where he had resided since.

Archie was preceded in death by his wife, Jeanette, on July 19, 2017 in Portland, after celebrating over 49 years of marriage together.

He started working in the woods directly after high school where he would hone his skills as a logger. After learning what he could from various loggers he started Archie Dass Logging. He successfully owned and operated it for over 40 years.

Archie was a member of the Forest Grove Elks Lodge B.P.O.E. # 2440.

Among his special interests, he enjoyed spending time traveling with his wife.

When not with her he was with his son and grandsons. Time spent with them might include traveling to hunting camp in Wallowa County or simply sitting around the kitchen table playing cards.

He was also preceded in death by his parents, Ike and Mary Dass and by his two sisters, Bernice Jenkins and Florence Buchanan.

Survivors include his son and daughter-in-law, Archie "Brent" and Karrie Dass of Vernonia; his two grandsons, Christopher Jacob "Chris" Dass and Johnathan Lane "John" Dass both of Vernonia; and his four sisters and a brother-in-law, Gladys Allbee of North Plains, Mary Jane Hornback of Bea-

verton, Eleanor Young of Hillsboro, and Jeannette and Marion Grant of Vernonia.

Also surviving are 27 nieces and nephews and numerous cousins.

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quarter, but the Loggers found themselves down by 1 with 42 seconds to go, until Sullivan hit a clutch three pointer with 15 seconds left to give the Loggers a 2 point lead. Knappa raced down the court and got a quick basket to tie the game 50-50 and the Loggers called timeout with just under 9 seconds to play. They in-bounded the ball to Sullivan, who was double and triple teamed as he quickly dribbled the ball up the court to the left side of the lane and then found Harral on the right side with a nifty left handed scoop pass to set up the clutch short jumper as the buzzer sounded for the win.

Sullivan had 31 points, 5 rebounds, 4 assists, and 2 steals, and was named Player of the Game for the Loggers. Handegard added 9 points and Harral had 6.

With the win the Loggers advanced to the semi finals where they faced league nemesis Columbia Christian. The Loggers played well early, with the lead changing hands throughout the first half. The Loggers trailed by just one point at the half, 32-31. A disastrous third quarter, in which the Loggers only managed to score one bucket and fell behind 50-33, sunk any chances Vernonia had of advancing to the final, and the game ended with the Loggers on the short end of the 67-48 score. For the Loggers, Sullivan scored 15 points and had 5 assists and Harral added 8 points. Senior Gaven Everett had a good night battling the

Knights big men inside and was named the Player of the Game for the Loggers after scoring 11 points and grabbing 9 rebounds.

With the loss the Loggers still had a chance for redemption in the third place game against #5 seed Oakland. The Loggers staked themselves a 25-17 lead at the half, but Oakland battled back to pull within 3 points at the end of the third quarter, 36-33. Oakland kept fighting and took a 4 point lead with 5:05 left in the game, but Sullivan and the Loggers were not going to be denied. Sullivan hit a jumper to pull the Loggers within 2, followed by a jumper by brother Kale Sullivan to tie the score at 45. Sullivan hit a three pointer but Oakland matched that to tie it at 48. Everett knocked down a free throw to give the Loggers a 1 point lead and Logger center Handegard blocked an Oakland shot before Sullivan hit a big jumper with 55 seconds left to extend the Logger lead to 3 points, 51-48. Oakland raced down court for a quick jumper of their own to cut the lead back down to 1, but the Loggers answered with a clutch jumper by Handegard extending the Logger lead to 53-50 with 28 seconds left. Oakland missed a 3 point attempt and Sullivan grabbed the rebound, was fouled, and calmly sank two free throws with 10 seconds left to seal the win for the Loggers, 55-50.
