County to Host Hearing, Open House in Vernonia *continued from page 3*

This year, the Board used the County's new mission statement to guide the budget process. The statement includes four principles that form the basis for serving the residents of Columbia County - "Service ~ Engagement ~ Connection ~ Innovation." With these principles, commissioners considered the County's priorities and goals as well as long-term financial stability.

The proposed FY18-19 budget totals nearly \$5.2 million higher than last year's. It includes increases of \$3.8 million in the Roads Fund and \$1.42 million in the Community Justice - Adult Corrections Department. The General Fund is about the same as last year at \$22.5 million.

Almost one-third (31.5 percent) is allocated to public safety functions. The General Fund makes up more than 35 percent, and includes a variety of general government services such as land use planning, public safety services including the Sheriff's Office patrol and

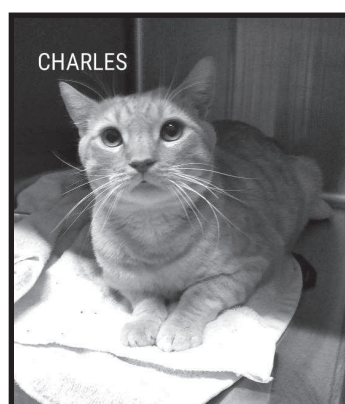
the county's emergency management, and county-wide support services such as Information Technology, and Human Resources. The Roads Fund and the Jail Operations Fund each have budgets totaling more than \$12 million and \$8 million respectively, and combined make up 32.7 percent of the County's FY18-19 operational footprint.

Commissioners will consider public comment taken at the hearings before voting on the budget at its June 27, 10:00 am weekly meeting at the County Courthouse.

"This year's budget shifts our focus to long-term strategic planning," said County Commissioner Alex Tardif, who also serves as the County's Budget Officer. "We encourage residents to tell us if we are heading in the right direction."
