guard Everett hit two 3-pointers to chip in 6 points.

The Lady Loggers fell to the #10 seed Enterprise Outlaws 37-31 in their opening game at Pendleton on February 28. The game was tied at 11-11 after the first quarter, but then the Lady Loggers shooters went cold. Junior Jordan Walters got into early foul trouble and had to sit for stretches of the game and Vernonia only scored 4 points in the second and third quarters combined, as the Outlaws held a 13 point lead at the end of the third quarter. Vernonia battled back in the fourth and had cut the margin to 6 late in the final period, but could get no closer.

Brooklyn Walters led the Lady Loggers with 14 points and was named the Player of the Game for Vernonia; Jordan Walters pitched in 8 points in the loss, while Hartman grabbed 8 rebounds and Lauren Ely added 6.

The Lady Loggers returned to action the next morning in the consolation round, facing the #3 seed Oakland. Vernonia looked much sharper and led 16-12 at the end of first quarter. They built on that lead through the second quarter, leading 29-20 at the end of the first half. Brooklyn Walters was on fire for the Lady Loggers in the first half, hitting 9-12 from the field, including 2-3 from 3-point range, for 18 points. Vernonia maintained their lead in the second half and led 37-27 at the end of the third quarter. The Lady Loggers extended the lead and played smart basketball in the fourth quarter, and won going away 50-38.


Brooklyn Walters led the Lady Loggers with 27 points and grabbed 8 rebounds and was again named Player of the Game. Jordan Walters scored 10 points and Hartman added 7. Everett grabbed 8 rebounds and Ely added 6. The Lady Loggers shot 46% from the field, including 62% in the first half. The Lady Loggers out rebounded the Outlaws 38-19.

The Lady Loggers faced the #9 seed Central Linn Cobras in their final game of the tournament with a chance to win the consolation bracket and take 4th place. Vernonia struggled early and trailed 9-6 at the end of the first quarter. The Lady Loggers' difficulties continued in the second quarter as they had trouble protecting the ball, turning it over 15 times in the half, and also had trouble scoring. A half court shot by Central Linn at the buzzer left the Lady Loggers trailing 24-17 at the half. Things did not get much better in the second half, and the Lady Loggers ended up on the losing end of a 45-31 score.

Jordan Walters scored 11 points and was named Player of the Game. Brooklyn Walters added 10 and Ely grabbed 9 rebounds for Vernonia.
