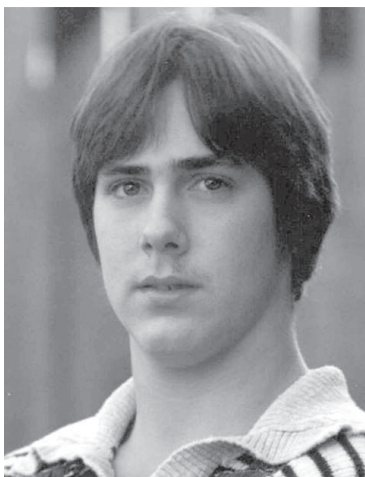


In Memory of...

Michael Scott Price, known as Mike or Mikey to family and friends, was born in Everett, Washington. He was raised in Washington and Oregon. Mikey moved to the Mist, Oregon area with his family when he was a young child. His parents worked at Mist Shake and Ridge, owned by Dick and Joyce Johnson, his uncle and aunt in Natal. Mike first attended Mist Grade School then Vernonia Junior High and graduated from Vernonia High School in the class of '77.

Mikey worked during his high school years helping at Mist Shake and Ridge and spent summers working in Petersburg, Alaska at Petersburg Fisheries and on family fishing and crabbing boats. One of the boats he worked on was the Apache, a 125 foot schooner. Also during his summers in Alaska, one of Mikey's duties was to keep track of the boats that needed to sell to the canneries and would relay that information

to his cousin Jim so he could make the rounds and deliver the fish to them for market. His many adventures during his time in Alaska included saving a hump-back whale by cutting it loose from a fishing net at only 14 years old! Another time he fell overboard into rough seas! He was lucky enough to have one of brother Billy's classmates to help him back aboard the ship. After high school Mikey joined the U.S. Navy and served four years learning to navigate aircraft. His dream at that time was to one day become a pilot. He spent a few years living and working with Billy in California where they shared many more adventures together. Later, both of them moved to Washington state where they worked with his dad at his roofing business. Other jobs he held in his early years was a greeter for an upscale restaurant, then decided to go back to Alaska where he worked laying the lines for a cable company. Eventually he moved back to Washington where he worked for many years as a machinist. He was a very versatile and talented man and did well at whatever he chose to do. Mikey, being a caregiver at heart, spent his last years giving care to others.

Mikey passed from complications of sepsis in Everett, Washington on December 27, 2020. He was preceded in death by his mother Juanita (Price) Olivo, and his father James L Price.

He is survived by three brothers, Larry and Jay Price of Granite Falls Washington, William (Billy) Price of Kelso Washington, and three sisters, Deborah VonHeeder of Vernonia, Oregon, Bonita (Bonnie) Quinn of Prineville, Oregon, and Joyce Cupp of Grande Ronde, Oregon. Mike was also survived by many loving cousins, nieces, nephews, and grand nieces and nephews.

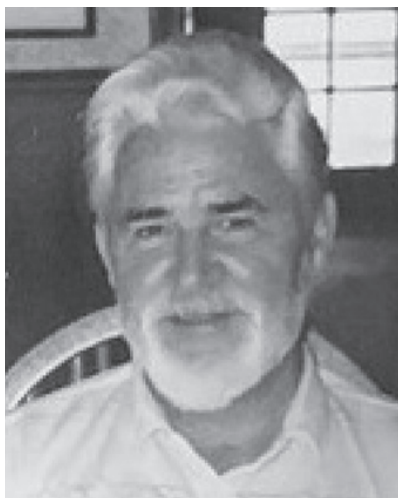
Mike's concept of the divine was one of universal love, forgiveness and compassion. He was grateful for this life and ready to approach what comes next.

Robert Richard Sargent passed away peacefully on June 12, 2021 at the age of 92 years old in his home in Turner, Oregon.

Bob was born in Eugene, Oregon to Cecil and Inez Sargent on April 11, 1929. He married Dorothy Stillwell on June 6, 1948 in Walla Walla, Washington and they were able to celebrate their 73rd wedding anniversary on June 6, 2021.

Bob attended San Jose Bible College (now William Jessup University), graduated from Northwest Christian College (now Bushnell University) in Eugene, Oregon, and received two master's degrees from Butler University, Indiana.

Bob and Dorothy raised eight children and were a part-time home to many other family and friends over the years. Bob spent most of his adult life in Christian Ministry as a pastor and as an educator. In addition to pastoring the Vernonia Christian Church in Vernonia he also taught school at Washington Elementary School and Mist Middle School.

In between their three different times in the Vernonia ministry, the Sargents developed lifelong friends in their ministries in Bell, California and at San Jose Bible College, San Jose, California. He was the Academic Dean at SJBC for 13 years and besides teaching classes and doing his administrative duties, he aided SJBC and other small colleges attain accreditations to make their college credits transferrable.

At retirement, he moved to Grass Valley, California then to Lakeside, Oregon, but mostly, he and Dorothy enjoyed their retirement traveling in

their motor home, particularly to River Lodge on the Colorado River where Bob spent time doing the activities he enjoyed most, golfing and painting.

He is preceded in death by his parents; seven siblings; sons, Ernest and Wayne Sargent, daughter Jeanie Haas; and grandson James Brooks.

He is survived by wife Dorothy; children Peggy Stone, Ann Cecil, Annette Eggert, Dennis Sargent, and Steve Sargent; 14 grandchildren; and 26 great grandchildren.
