CRESWELL – Every year, autumn leaves are swept into roads and storm drains as citizens tidy their yards, causing clogging issues with the water recycling process. From October through December, the City of Creswell provides a free-of-

charge leaf pick-up service. All you have to do is bag your leaves and put them on the curb. Submit your request on the city's website or call City Hall at 541-895-2531 and Public Works employees will pick them up, usually the same day.
