Vandals ‘bomb’ passing cars

OCT. 30, 1969 — Oregon State Police said Monday they would increase patrol and vigilance in the wake of a series of pumpkin “bombings” carried out from overpasses that cross Interstate 5 in this area.

An OSP spokesman said the first reported incident of a pumpkin dropped on a passing car was reported Oct. 22 shortly before midnight. A citizens band radio report notified police that a series of pumpkins had been dropped on passing vehicles from the Dale Kuni Road, Market Road and Turnell Road overpasses.

The incident continued through the weekend, the police spokesman said, adding that one of them shattered the windshield of a semi-trailer rig. The driver was unhurt and proceeded after the incident.

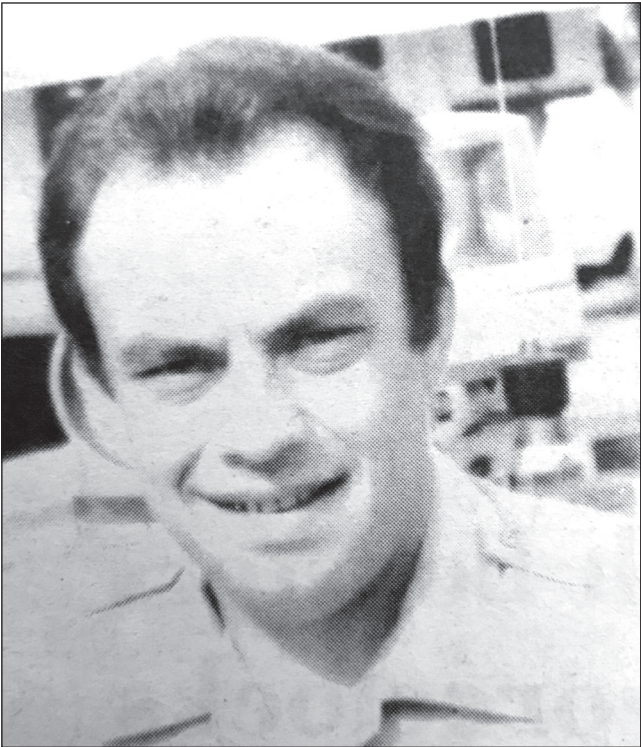
New deputy begins Creswell duty
