## MOUNTAINEER'S SAVINGS.

Mostly in Gold, and Some of It Has Been Buried for Fifty Years.

The First National Bank of Logan, W. Va., has received a deposit to-day which has an interesting story behind it, the Roanoke correspondent of the Baltimore Sun says. The amount is \$6,020, of which \$5,000 is in gold coin, some of which is fifty years old. Twenty dollars is in silver and there are fifty \$20 bills. The money had been accumulated by Milton Mullens and represents the savings of a lifetime.

Mullens began hoarding his savings when a young man. This was before the civil war. All his surplus he converted into gold, which he buried in the yard. A few years ago, when gold coin was scarce and almost out of circulation, Mullens began to exchange his smaller money for \$20 bills.

These were hidden in a safe place in his barn. It was believed for many years that he was hoarding his money and on numerous occasions marauders have endeavored to force him to reveal his hiding place, but without success.

A few days ago his wife died and believing that he would not live long he called his grandson, J. M. Perry, and told him where to search for the treasure. The young man, after digging for some time, found the treasure, and this snug little fortune went into the bank to the credit of the now aged and infirm mountaineer.



## THE FAMILY DOCTOR

Respiration in health and under normal conditions of rest or moderate exercise is an unconscious act, almost as much so as digestion or the beating of the heart, but it is very easily disturbed, even in health, and in certain diseases its disturbance is one of the most distressing symptoms. The short breath following violent exertion, such as running or hill-climbing, is familiar to every one. It is due to the increased call for oxygenation of the blood and the temporary inability of the heart to pump the blood in sufficient volume through the lungs.

When shortness of breath is brought about by moderate exercise or mental excitement, it is due to some abnormal condition, such as anemia, obesity, a weak heart or indigestion. This tendency is relieved by attention to the weak point, whatever it may be, and a judicious system of exercises—a sort of modified training.

Permanent shortness of breath, or dyspnea, as it is technically called, is a more serious affair, and is usually due to some actual disease. What the disease is of which this dyspnea is a symptom can often be discovered only by a careful and thorough medical examination of all the organs of the body.

It is often called asthma, and treated at home by inhaling the fumes of burning niter paper or by some other of the ordinary remedies. But asthma is a distinct disease, although its true nature is not yet definitely determined. It occurs in paroxysms, usually at night, in the intervals of which the breathing is generally easy and quiet. Permanent dyspnea is another matter, and is an indication of something wrong.

It may be due to a great variety of causes, only a few of which can be mentioned here.

Anemia, or poverty of blood, may give rise to permanent dyspnea, as well as to shortness of breath on exertion. The symptom is a regular accompaniment of diminished lung capacity, either through consolidation of more or less of the lung tissue in tuberculosis or pneumonia, or through compression of the lungs by an accumulation of fluid or air in the chest.

Anything that interferes with the free action of the heart, such as weakness of the cardiac muscle or disease of the valves of the heart, pressure by fatty deposits, an enlarged liver, or, as in the stomach, will produce shortness of breath.

Short breath in children is commonly the result of obstruction in the air passages, caused by enlarged tonsils, the presence of glandular tissue in the pharynx, called adenoids, or a swollen condition of the mucous membrane of the larynx.

Persistent shortness of breath is a symptom that should not be neglected.

### Buddha.

The origin of Buddhism, which ranks in numbers among the great religions of the world, is wrapped in much uncertainty, and the personality of its founder is more or less obscure. It is generally believed that Buddha was a prince of a petty Indian nation and that he was born about the beginning of the fifth century before Christ. He was named Siddhartha and was also known as Saky, his family name. The title of Buddha, which was given him, means "the enlightened." He spent many years in study and solitary meditation and finally evolved the philosophy which he preached for over forty years in northern India. He was about eighty when he died.—Youth's Companion.

## Sunken Roman Galleys.

Beneath the waters of Lake Nemi, in Italy, lie buried two pleasure galleys. They belonged to the Emperors Tiberius and Caligula, and it is said they contain art treasures that have been covered for many centuries. Systematic efforts were made to recover the contents of the old hulks by Signor Borghi in 1895. Divers were engaged, and the two galleys located, measured and carefully examined, and from both bronzes, pieces of wood, anchors and ornaments of all kinds were collected. The larger vessel measures about 230 feet in length and 80 feet in beam, and the smaller 200 feet in length and 65 feet in beam. Some pieces of lead pipe were found in the vessels. They bear the inscription, "Caesaris Aug. Germanice," the official name of Caligula.

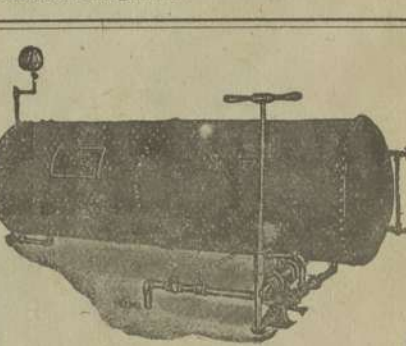
