

After having opposed any appropriation for a new dormitory for boys at the Chemawa Indian school, the house conferees on the interior department appropriation bill compromised on an appropriation of \$50,000 subject to the approval of the house.

Fore-leg of mutton, 1 cup rice, 1 small onion, 2 tenspoons salt, 1½ cups canned tomatoes. Cut meat from bone into pieces 2 inches square. Minee onions, wash rice. In a buttered casserolarity serole put a layer of meat, then a layer of rice and so on until all is used. Add onion to tomatoes with salt and pep-per. Pour over meat and rice in casserole. Add water to cover. Cover and cook in a slow oven for two hours. Add more water as necessary.

Two cups flour, 1 cup milk, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons sugar, 2 tenspoons baking powder. Beat yolks and sugar together, bent whites and add milk and flour with the baking powder; put in but tered cups, first layer of dough, then layer of fruit and repeat until about three-fourths full. Cranberry Jelly. Simmer 1 quart of eranberries in half pint of water for half an hour, then squeeze water and berries through jelly bag, add 1 pound of sugar. Boil for 10 minutes and test.
