Isolated sections of the county, sections with a small part of the population, were cared for under the old convention system. Under the primary system the offices go usually to the centers of the voting population. It can not be again.

The newspapers may be reasonably expected to oppose a return to the convention system, for the primary system is a source of considerable profit. to them and gives them power they can not hold under the convention sys-



Under the primaries candidates are absolutely dependent upon the advertising columns and news columns of the papers. A candidate who can not get into the news columns of the state ree of charge has little chance of win-

ning nigh office.

The man who has been able for years to get into the news columns and who is able to do the same thing during a campaign has, under the primary system, what is better than a huge campaign fund. This was demonstrated in the recent gubernatorial race.
