Mr. Live Business Man! There are many forms which a business firm may use that cost but little yet save a great deal of time and make a record that often proves convenient and valuable. For example it is often convenient to have a carbon copy of each order that is sent to a wholesale house. It is then possible to find in a moment what goods have been ordered. The date they were ordered can be learned at the same time. It is often important to know whether a mistake in an order was made by the person placing the order or by the person shipping it. The carbon copy gives the information in a moment. It is often important to have a list of items covered by a check, as well as a record of discounts taken. Duplicate remittance blanks give this information at once to the person receiving the check and the same information is on file with the person making the remittance.
