TOOTH DECAY DUE TO BREAD

Exhaustive Experiments Have Exhausted Sweets From Biome Which Has Been Attached to Them. The general belief that the consumption of jams, jellies and such sweets are responsible for the progress of decay in our teeth, has not been borne out by experiments which were made at the hygienic institute of the Leipzig university.

On the other hand it was indicated that bread was responsible for such troubles. This was shown by taking perfectly sound teeth and coating them with wax, into which an aperture was made at one point or another, and these were then subjected to an immersion in a mixture of bread and saliva at a temperature of 37 degrees Centigrade.
