OREGON ROADS TO RECEIVE AID FROM FORESTRY FUNDS

Eugene-Florence Highway Between Rainrock and Blachly Gets Sum of \$37,500. Expenditures totaling \$367,250 of national forest highway funds to apply on the construction of over 110 miles of highway in Oregon have just been approved by Secretary of Agriculture Wallace.

The sum of \$37,500 has been authorized for the Eugene-Florence highway between Rainrock and Blachly in Lane county. With the funds furnished by the county this additional appropriation brings the total for this 24-mile stretch up to \$375,000.
