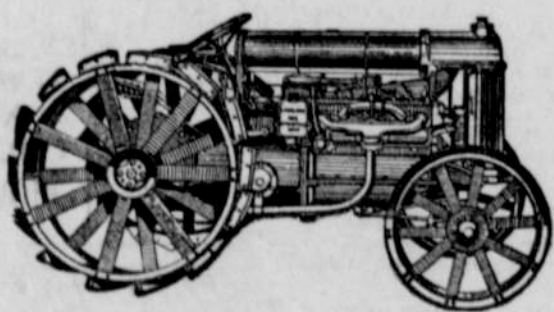

LANE COUNTY GETTING TOO MANY PLUMS IS PROTEST

Eclipse of Sun Coming.

For the first time since 1918 an eclipse of the sun, visible from Cottage Grove, is scheduled for Monday, September 10. Although not quite a total eclipse, such as the last one, the display this year will be about 80 per cent. The shadow will pass in a southwest direction toward the south and in southern California and Mexico the eclipse will be total. The time of the extreme shadow will be about noon or shortly after.

Judge King Will Quit.

Alta King, for four years city recorder of Eugene, has announced that he expects to resign within a few weeks and will either resume his law practice, which he gave up to accept the position of recorder, or will accept a position in the legal department of one of the state commissions that has been offered him. Judge King said that he is relinquishing the office on account of the comparatively low salary attached to it, which is \$160 a month.

Eugene Banks Make Service Charge.
Eugene banks have decided upon a service charge of 50 cents the month upon all accounts that average less than \$50 and upon which checks have been drawn during the month.

Cottage Grove banks have as yet taken no action along that line.

careless and reckless driving.

Mr. Kem admits that he is not a constitutional lawyer, but he must know that enforcement of law becomes a travesty when peace officers are permitted to make the law, which they would in fact be doing under Mr. Kem's plan.

Mr. Kem errs in his interpretation of the law when he infers that the state has said that a greater speed than 30 miles an hour is a dangerous speed. The state has not said that, but it is the duty of the state to protect the lives and property of its citizens and it says that if that limit is observed the lives and property of its citizens should be safe. In setting this limit it has taken into consideration the human element. It knows that many drivers will operate their cars with defective brakes, it knows that many drivers will operate cars likely to go to pieces if driven at a greater speed. It knows that many drivers who could pass a first class examination ought not to drive at a greater speed. Therefore it sets that as a safe speed.

Mr. Kem errs seriously when he says that the fact that a driver is operating within the speed limit is a defense in case he injures person or property. Nothing could be further from the facts.

Let us quote the law, which reads as follows:

"Every person operating a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state shall drive the same in a careful and prudent manner, not to exceed 30 miles per hour, and within the limits of incorporated cities and towns not to exceed 20 miles per hour, and at intersections and schoolhouses not to exceed 12 miles per hour, and in no case at a rate of speed that will endanger the property of another, or the life and limb of any person."

This quotation of the law takes all the wind out of Mr. Kem's sails. The thing he asks for is already law, with the addition of a speed limit. Taking off the limit could only benefit the speed demon.

Read the law again, Mr. Kem, and we feel quite certain you will be of the opinion that your arguments are several years behind the operation of the law.

The Sentinel maintains its former position, that permanent suspension of a driver's license would not be constitutional. Even if such a punishment were constitutional, we have ample evidence that the full penalty of the law would not be carried out. Murderers have been given life sentences and released within a few years. Permanent suspension of a driver's license would mean no more than a year's suspension, which is now a penalty for reckless and careless driving. The power that suspended could reinstate, and that is what would happen in 90 per cent of the cases.

Finally, neither permanent suspension of licenses nor the lifting of the speed limit is likely ever to become the law of the land, regardless of what we may think about it. We have got to get the reckless driver by some other method. Failing him is about the best remedy we have at hand.
