



Equipping the Wheelbarrow with Shock Absorbers

The shocks suffered when pushinga wheelbarrow over rough ground can be largely eliminated by prov ling the wheel with shock absorbers made from ouggy-spring leaves. The leaves used for this pur-



pose have eyes at the ends; each is cut to a length of about 8 in., and has three cr four screwholes drilled through it.

The eyes are reamed out so that they will accommodate the axle of the wheel and allow it to turn easily, and the springs are screwed to the underside of the wheelbarrow frame, the eyes being turned down.

Working on Side of Building The method of working on the wall ot a building as shown in the illustration is used by circus-bill posters to put up their signs in places that are otherwise nearly inaccessible. Two ladders are used; one is laid on the roof, and



the other is lashed to the projecting end, and hangs vertically. One man remains on the extreme inner end of the horizontal ladder, while another climbs down the vertical ladder, the weight of the first man keeping the whole arrangement in position. The horizontal ladder should not project over the edge of the roof more than one-fourth or one-fifth of the entire length of this ladder and the man holding it down must apply his weight at the extreme inner end; he must be about equal to the other man in weight. In this way he will be able to hold the man on the ladder securely.

Cleaning Rusty Crosscut Saws

An excellent method of cleaning and polishing an old rusty crosscut saw is as follows: Drill a vertical hole in the center of a small stump, and also saw a cut across it, passing through the hole; the depth of this cut should equal the width of the saw, minus the teeth. Invert the saw in the cut, allowing the teeth to project above the surface of the stump. Fill the hole around the saw with fine sand and moisten with a little water. By working the saw as if sawing, it will quickly be scoured clean and bright as when new.
