## How New Potato Law Is Working.

No stronger argument for stand-  
ardization and shipping point in-  
spection could be made than the  
following letter from the United  
States department of agriculture  
of California to R. L. Ringer of the  
same department in Portland:  
San Francisco, Calif., Dec. 5.—For  
the past several years Oregon po-  
tatoes have been considered the poor-  
est potato and the riskiest "bet"  
of any stock used in the San Fran-  
cisco market. Several years ago  
they were in fairly good demand  
until, through years of diminishing  
quality, they could not be used un-  
less received on consignment.

Fancy California Burbanks, from  
the San Joaquin river delta lands,  
have always commanded the highest  
prices here, but this year the Oregon  
Burbank is running them a close  
second. California stock, special  
packs, are bringing \$2.00 per cwt.,  
as top price, and the Oregon tuber  
"as is" is selling at \$1.90 with a  
strong market and increasing de-  
mand, one that if the quality is  
maintained will surpass the demand  
of any other potato.

As a comparison of values and  
grading, the Washington and Idaho  
potatoes, which have always been  
in good demand here, are repacked  
upon arrival and put in first class  
condition. The highest prices realized  
on them, to the jobber, is \$1.60  
per cwt.

There is not a dealer who has not  
at some time or another, expressed  
enthusiasm regarding the Oregon  
quality this year.

State-federal shipping point in-  
spection will soon be demanded by  
shippers and large growers generally  
on fruit, vegetables, potatoes, grain  
and other commodities. The demand  
is rapidly spreading over the states.  
It is a form of insurance; it guar-  
antees standard products; it aids i.  
o. b. sales; it is the shippers' pro-  
tection in state and federal courts  
and it guarantees the highest price.

One of Portland's large potato  
shippers recently asked inspection of  
a carload from the state market  
agent. The inspector found the  
stock was not up to the grade and  
he graded them as No. 2. The ship-  
per then resorted the car, called out  
all that were not No. 1 and then  
shipped the car to San Francisco.  
He reports that he received a higher  
price for the sorted potatoes than  
he would have received for the  
whole car, saved considerable on  
freight charges and that the buyers  
wrote him to make them further  
shipments of the same quality.

## Farmers' Marketing Program.

In the place of the usual farmers'  
week at the Oregon Agricultural  
college, there will be held an agri-  
cultural economic conference Janu-  
ary 21 to 25, to take up and work  
out a comprehensive program of  
production and marketing. The best  
members of the state will be present  
and it is hoped that a line of action  
may be determined that will help  
the farmers out of their present  
serious condition.
