the past several years Oregon pota-toes have been considered the poor-est potato and the riskiest "bet" of any stock used in the San Francisco market. Several years ago they were in fairly good demand until, through years of diminishing quality, they could not be used un-less received on consignment.

Fancy California Burbanks, from he San Joaquin river delta lands, have always prices here, but this year the Oregon Burbank is running them a cle second. California stock, specpacks, are bringing \$2.00 per cwt., as top price, and the Oregon tube strong market and mand, one that if the quality is maintained will surpass the demand

As a comparison of values and grading, the Washington and Idaho ootatoes, which have always been n good demand here, are repacked upon arrival and put in first class condition. The highest prices real-ized on them, to the jobber, is \$1.60
