Many Want District Attorneyship. The district attorneyship seems to be the most popular office in Lane county and there are now four candidates for the republican nomination including the incumbent, Clyde N. Johnston, of Junction City. The other aspirants are H. M. Brownell, Gordon S. Wells and Walter B. Jones, all of Eugene. There will be a democratic contest in the November election with the successful candidate in the republican primaries.

Bell Talked for State Treasurer. J. B. Bell, of Eugene, former joint senator for Lane and Linn counties and interested in a number of Willamette valley banks, is being considered as a possible candidate for state treasurer. The late O. P. Hoff, who filled the office of state treasurer at the time of his death, was a resident of Lane county before being elected labor commissioner 18 years ago.

Medley May Be Candidate. J. S. Medley, of Eugene, may be a candidate for the democratic nomination for district attorney. Mr. Medley, who practiced law here for many years before going to Eugene to accept a deputyship under J. M. Devers several years ago, is a native of the county and is well known throughout the county as an attorney.

Registration Closes Soon. Registration for the primary election must be completed 30 days before election day, which makes April 16 the last day upon which registrations may be accepted. Voters may register with the county clerk or with a local registrar. O. O. Veatch is the registrar for Cottage Grove.
