PHYSICIAN FILES ANSWER TO ROY GRIGGS AND MOON

Dr. W. C. Rebhan, of Springfield, who a short time ago was sued by Roy Griggs and R. E. Moon for heavy damages on account of alleged x-ray burns, has filed answers to both suits.

In the case of Griggs, the physician says in his answer that in February, 1923, Griggs came to him and asked that something be done for his stomach. Suspecting that he might be suffering from ulcers in the stomach, it was advised that x-ray pictures be taken. It is stated in the answer that Dr. M. A. Holmes, a graduate physician and x-ray technician and roentgenologist, made the x-ray exposures and that Holmes was acting on his own account. Dr. Rebhan says that Griggs had no ulcers and was cured of his stomach trouble later. Later, he says, he believes Griggs applied liniments and ointments that caused the x-ray burns to become worse and that he ceased to come for treatments.

In the case brought by Moon, Dr. Rebhan alleges in his answer that the defendant, after he had been under the x-rays administered by Dr. Holmes, exposed himself to the rays administered by other physicians a number of times and accentuated the burns.

FEDERAL INCOME TAX IS REDUCED FOR THIS YEAR

The tax bill recently enacted by congress provides for a 25 per cent decrease in last year's federal income tax. Those who have paid the tax in full will receive a rebate without any action on their part. Those who have paid but a part of the tax are privileged to make the necessary adjustment in making their next payment. That is done simply by taking the original amount due the government and deducting 25 per cent. The remainder will be the total of the amount due this year and the taxpayer may reduce his next payment to the extent that will bring the total paid this year up to the amount due. Fifty per cent of the reduced amount must be paid by June 15.

FOREST FIRE FIGHTING ENGINE THROWS WATER

A small gasoline pump, capable of throwing a stream from an inch and a half hose a distance of 60 to 70 feet has just been purchased by the Western Lane County Fire Control association. The little machine can be carried on a man's back over mountain trails and in case of fire in forests adjacent to water it is considered very efficacious. One thousand feet of hose came with the pump.

The machine and hose will be taken to the headquarters of fire fighting operations in the Coast mountains and will be rushed to the first fire that is reported in that district.

The pump attracted a great deal of attention at a recent demonstration held in Eugene.

Roads to Crater Lake Are Open. Continued rapid melting of snow in Crater lake national park has resulted in a very early opening of park roads. As a result, all three entrance roads are open to automobile traffic to the rim. The road from government camp to the rim opened May 27, about four weeks earlier than normal.

The official opening of the park is set for July 1, as usual, but visitors with camping equipment are permitted to enter.
