57 VARIETIES OF EXPENSE CUT DOWN THE PROFITS

Probably half the persons who buy a pound of coffee, a box of matches or a sack of flour have the general idea that the profit of the retail merchant is the difference between the price paid the wholesaler and the price paid by the consumer.

New Home Brew Recipe.

PRESIDENT CAMPBELL GIVES LIBERALLY TO UNIVERSITY

Eugene, Ore., June 2.—A gift of \$30,000 to the University of Oregon by President P. L. Campbell and family brings the total of subscriptions to the alumni gift campaign fund up to \$312,232. The president's gift was made in the names of Mr. and Mrs. Campbell, Mrs. E. A. Hansen and Walter Church, of Berkeley, Calif.

Graduates and former students are giving liberally to the fund which is to be used for sorely needed buildings, particularly a new library building, on the campus at Eugene. Contributions are being received from all parts of the country. Alumni in New York city have sent \$4400, in Boston \$4480, in Washington, D. C., \$1140, in Los Angeles \$3000, in Spokane \$2900, in Berkeley \$1950, in Vancouver \$1140, in Seattle \$2505, in Medford \$3550. These figures represent only a part of what can be expected before the campaign is over.

One graduate in Portland, a man who came to Eugene as a student with a total capital of 50 cents, worked his way through the university and later worked his way through the Columbia university law school in New York city, gave \$3500 to the fund. He said he estimated that his education cost the university \$1200 and he wanted to pay it back with heavy interest.

EARLE REFUSES SALARY AS LANE COUNTY OFFICIAL

H. H. Earle, who has been relieved of his office as hoof and mouth disease inspector for the county, has refused to accept the salary which was provided for him by the former county court. At the time that Mr. Earle was appointed to the position he was a candidate for the democratic nomination for sheriff and the fact that he was put on the county pay roll by the county commissioners, who were under fire and was provided with an automobile was the subject of some adverse comment. Mr. Earle accepted the use of the automobile but with the refusal of the salary provided for him he received nothing for his services.
