LINN COUNTY AGENT IS MAKING POOL IN PYROTOL

Pyrotol, a new explosive that is being made out of surplus war ma-terial, will be available for distri-bution to farmers in Lane county this winter according to C. R. Briggs, county agent of Linn county. Last winter over 40 tons

of sodotol was distributed to the farmers of the Linn, Lane and Benton counties by combining the orders from these three counties and it is thought that it will be necessary to do this again this year in order to insure earload rates. Pyrotol is made out of surplus smokeless powder that has been

ground and mixed with nitrate of soda. Because it is a little strong-er than dynamite it is somewhat faster. Orders for pyrotol will be pooled through the county agent's office at Corvallis. The cost of the py-rotol, laid down in Corvallis, is \$7.99 the hundred.

Road to Be Barricaded. The Mapleton-Cushman road, built by the Southern Pacific railway, is to be barricaded during the winter months on account of its dangerous condition. Many of the dangerous places will be widened before the road is opened for traffic in the spring. A speed limit of 10 miles has been placed upon the road.

This road has been the subject of much contention for many years. It was built by the railway to take the place of a roadway taken by the railway for its roadbed for its Coos bay line. After several years of wrangling, the railway and the recent county court ar-ranged a compromise.
