**Planing Window Frames**

For fitting windows and doors, etc., the device shown in the illustration will be found very handy.

It consists of a long board of any suitable size at hand, a short piece of wood nailed to this at an angle of about 45°, a vertical brace for the angular piece, and a block nailed to the base at the bottom of the brace. The upper end of the angular piece or stop is notched deeply to take the ends of the windows or doors, and the block is notched in the same manner; the method of setting up the work to be planed is apparent from the illustration. The device will be found convenient not only for doors and windows, but for other similar work too large for the vise, and it can easily be carried from room to room.
