PROHIBITION ENFORCEMENT.

(Accepting The Sentinel's oft-repeated request for suggestions for editorial subjects, a reader has asked that this great family journal discuss the prohibition enforcement problem.)

A majority of the people of Oregon voted several years ago for prohibition, yet it is extremely doubtful whether a majority of the people ever have practiced prohibition.

We either want prohibition or we do not want it, but whether we want it or not, we have the prohibition laws and we have elected or appointed officials whose sworn duty it is to enforce these laws.

The view taken by many is that the crime is not in breaking the law but in being caught. Speaking generally, the disgrace should be no less to be known to be a law breaker than to be caught at it.

The recent legislature made much more severe the penalties for violation of the prohibition laws. Future legislatures probably will make them even more severe.

When the time arrives that the person who drinks is sent to jail, either the law will be enforced or it will be repealed.

Regardless of what the future may bring forth, it may be safely said that if those who would feel seriously injured by being convicted of a prohibition law violation should cease drinking the vile and damnable stuff that is manufactured these days, there would be few moonshiners and few bootleggers.
