NOTICE OF SALE OF \$25,000.00 OF WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received for the sale of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, of "Water System Improvement Bonds" by the City Recorder of said City at his office in the City of Cottage Grove until the hour of eight o'clock P. M. on Wednesday the 10th day of June, 1925, at which time and in the Council Chamber of the City of Cottage Grove, said bids will be opened and considered by the Common Council of said City; said Bonds shall bear date the first day of June, 1925, and will be due as to principal and payable by the City of Cottage Grove as follows:

Principal due twenty (20) years from date; said bonds to be issued in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) with interest bearing coupons attached, bearing interest at not to exceed five (5) per cent per annum from date of issuance; and the said interest to be paid semi-annually on the first day of December and the first day of June each year after the date of issuance. The City reserves the right to retire any or all of said Bonds after ten (10) years from date thereof and the principal and interest shall be payable at the City Treasurer's office in Cottage Grove, Oregon. The whole of said Bonds shall be concurrent and shall be without priority as to each other and shall be a general obligation of the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon.

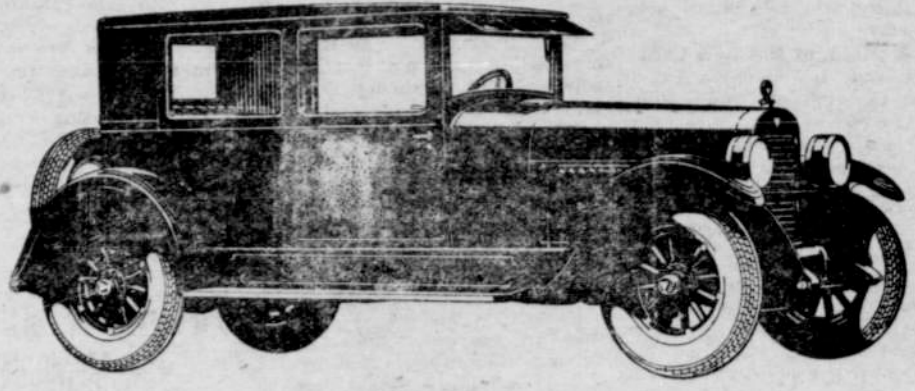

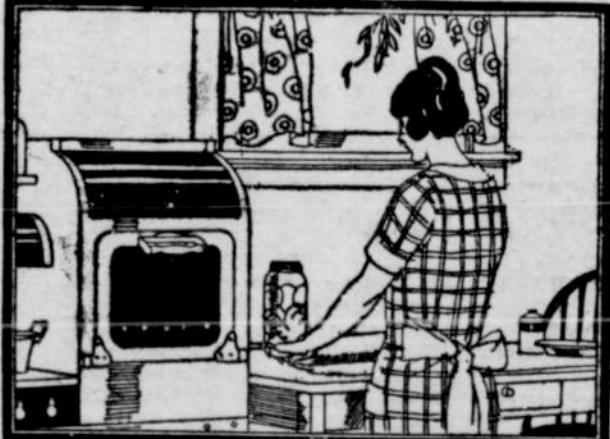
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
