He signified his intention to lay out the fine and was taken to the county jail. District Attorney Madley was here to prosecute the case.

Fire Damages Roof. Fire Friday forenoon at the Ostrander place a mile northeast of the city damaged one side of the kitchen roof. The house is occupied by the James Town family. At home at the time were Mrs. Tate, mother of Mrs. Town, and Ellen and Eileen Town, children of Mr. and Mrs. Town. Mrs. Tate, with the assistance of Mrs. Ferguson and Mrs. Dustin, neighbors, extinguished the flames. The Ostrander property is a distance outside the city, nevertheless the fire department responded to the alarm, arriving late because of having difficulty in finding the road to the place. It was thought that the fire started from sparks from the chimney, although there had been only a moderate fire in the house that day.

Fire Destroys Barn. A fire of unknown origin on Thursday afternoon completely destroyed a barn on the Perkins estate northeast of the city. The building had been vacant for a number of years but recently one of the employees of the J. C. Compton company was living there temporarily. Some of his personal property was destroyed. A man working at the Compton paving plant, which is situated nearby, ran an emergency water line to the fire.
