The pear leaf blister mite has developed as a serious pest on apples in Oregon during the last five years. It affects both the foliage and fruit. The infestation on the foliage is easily observed because of the peculiar thickened blister-like spots it causes. The spots are usually of a reddish or brown color. A careful sprayer will have little trouble in controlling the blister mite on pears with the dormant strength of lime sulfur, 9-100, after the leaves drop.
