A MOST UNUSUAL CASE

(Eugene Register.) On the night of September 1 W. R. Lloyd murdered a taxi driver on the highway near Independence and stole his car. He explained later that he wanted an automobile and that that, on the whole, seemed the easiest way to get it. He was caught, tried and convicted, and since he had neither money nor friends and there was nothing about him to appeal to...

His case is so unusual that it deserves comment. It was not intimated that he was insane. It does not appear even that he shot in self defense. There was no bitter legal battle, with long delays and frequent appeals. The public seems actually to have felt some pity for his poor victim, instead of lavishing all its sympathies, as is customary, on the killer. There appears to have been on the part of those connected with the trial only a sincere desire to get at the truth as to his guilt or innocence and to fix a penalty in accordance with the crime.

The result, as already stated, is that only three months elapsed between the killing and the payment by the killer of the penalty fixed by the law. The public received no confused impression that may be, after all, the accused murderer was more sinned against than sinning and that perhaps he was a noble but misunderstood character. The extremely valuable lesson is taught that punishment follows crime, that the arm of the law is long and that they way of the transgressor is hard.

We have an idea—an odd idea, probably, in these modern times—that if all murderers were dealt with in this oddly unsentimental but extremely just and businesslike manner there would be fewer killings and much less tearful talk about what we are coming to. The murder record of this country is something frightful to contemplate. It would be far less frightful in a few years if punishment were prompt and sure.
