Some Little-Known Facts About Sleep

The harder a man works the less sleep he requires; strong coffee does not help to keep people awake, and anyone who goes without sleep for three nights in succession will feel far more tired on the second night than on the third.

These startling statements have all been proved true by psychologists.

The investigators believe that the human race sleeps too much. During a recent test nine people of each sex went without sleep for 80 hours. At the end of that time it was found that eight to ten hours' sleep was sufficient to restore them to normal.

Exercise and moderate eating helped the subjects of the experiment to keep awake. They swam, drove motor-cars, and played games. After 45 hours of wakefulness it was found very difficult to drive a motor-car, but on the third night drowsiness almost completely disappeared, and driving became comparatively easy.

Although physical strength declines as the result of any serious loss of sleep, mental alertness is in no way dulled.

Ozone Produced by Seaweed in Decaying

The name ozone simply means "a smell," since long ago it was noted that oxygen through which an electric spark had passed gave off a peculiar smell, the scent which we perceive at electricity works or in some of the tube railways, where artificially produced ozone is employed to purify the air. In nature, ozone is found often in the atmosphere after a thunderstorm, or in very tiny quantities on mountains or at the seaside, or even in the country. Town air, laden with impurities, is impossible for it. So that there really is a certain amount of ozone present near the sea. It is not this, however, that the visitor smells, the proportion being far too small for notice—but the gas given off by decaying seaweed, the very pronounced odor from the latter being almost invariably put down as due to "ozone"!

Mammoth Water Tank

Nairobi, in East Africa, has the distinction of possessing the largest municipal steel water tank in the world. It holds a million gallons and was erected by the Nairobi corporation to prevent the night waste of 200,000 gallons of water, owing to lack of storage facilities.

The Nairobi tank is mosquito-proof, is erected with manholes to facilitate cleaning, is painted inside with a special paint to prevent corrosion, and is halved by a partition to enable one portion of the tank to be used while the other is being cleaned out, which will be necessary at least every five years.

The weight of the water to be stored is 4,500 tons, over an area of 10,800 square feet.

Engineers' Good Work

The pontoon bridge constructed by the First engineers of the army of occupation across the Rhine in Germany was constructed in 41 minutes, 8 seconds on June 8, 1919. The bridge was constructed at Huningen, Germany. The river there is 1,400 feet wide. The depth of the channel is approximately 25 feet. The strength of the current is about 4 miles per hour. There were 93 boats and 3 trestles used in the bridge and 400 engineers soldiers were used in its construction. The best time made by the Second engineers in the constructing of a pontoon bridge at the same point under similar conditions was 58 minutes, 30 seconds.

Rainfall Statistics

The records of the weather bureau show that the largest average annual amount of precipitation in the United States proper is received at points near the Pacific coast in Washington and Oregon. The weather bureau station at Glenora, Ore., shows an average annual fall of 131.54 inches for 25 years. Larger rainfalls are received at many points outside of the United States. A number of weather bureau stations in the Hawaiian islands have an average of 300 inches a year. The one receiving the largest fall, Mount Waialeale, with a record of several years, shows an annual average of 476 inches.

Famous Art Work

A famous painting by Gerome is that of the victor of a gladiatorial contest standing over his vanquished rival, looking toward the spectators for their verdict. They are represented with thumbs down (the latter being the meaning of the words pollice verso), which signal meant death to the defeated. A well-known philologist has passed the opinion that "the thumb symbolized the short Roman sword, and the gesture which meant the death of the vanquished gladiator was given by turning the hand over, into an unnatural position, with the thumb (sword) pointing at the defeated man."

Died in World War

Brig Gen. Edward Sigler, who died October 7, 1918, was the highest ranking officer killed overseas in the World war. The next highest in rank were four colonels. They were Col. H. W. Parker, killed September 29, 1918; Col. Hamilton A. Smith, killed July 22, 1918; Col. Elmer J. Wallace, killed November 5, 1918, and Col. Robert S. Welsh, killed November 5, 1918.

First Italian Opera

The first Italian opera, as distinguished from a musical drama, was "Daphne," which was produced by the Society of the Altera in a private house in Florence in 1590. The music was by Caccial and Peri.
